For somebody who is a first timer, the menu card offered a lot of surprises. Coffee Day brings you a wide variety of brews, both Indian and International. From the regular Espresso and Cappuccino, to their international concoctions of Kenyan Safari, Colombian Juan Valdez and the Ethiopian Qalwah-there's more here than you can hope to find! In their Cold Coffee section, one finds 4-5 varieties of exotic sounding names like Tropical Iceberg, Faffe Frappe and even Coffee on the rocks! For those who like to grab a bite along with their cup of brew, the cafe also offers you sandwiches, Burgers, Pizzas and samosas. And for people like who suffer from a sweet tooth, there are Chocolate Brownies out of the Nougat Cake,

Doughnuts, Mocha and Plum cake.

Judging from the tastefully done-up interiors one might expect it to be a little heavy on the pocket. But, surprisingly, all the items are reasonably and affordably priced allowing even a daily stopover. The regular hot coffees range between Rs. 10 - Rs.20 and their international brews between Rs.18 - Rs.30 as do the varieties of Cold Coffee. You can even pack a takeaway cup for your drive.

Coffee day originated from Bangalore where it has nine branches. The only other city they chose to open is our very own Hyderabad where they plan to start two more outlets. Coffee Day also has a lot of interesting schemes to attract the young with gifts like CD's, cool T-shirts, funky wings and snazzy caps.
